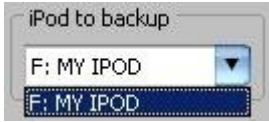


iCloner user guide

Creating a backup image of your iPod (call it copy, mirror, ghost if that suits you better)

Note: all the operations you will perform to create a backup image of your image will take place in the UPPER HALF of iCloner called "Backup".

Start by selecting the iPod you wish to back up.



Then click the "Browse..." button.

In the window that appears, give a name to your backup file (for instance the date of the backup or the name of the iPod owner) and choose a destination folder for this file on your computer.

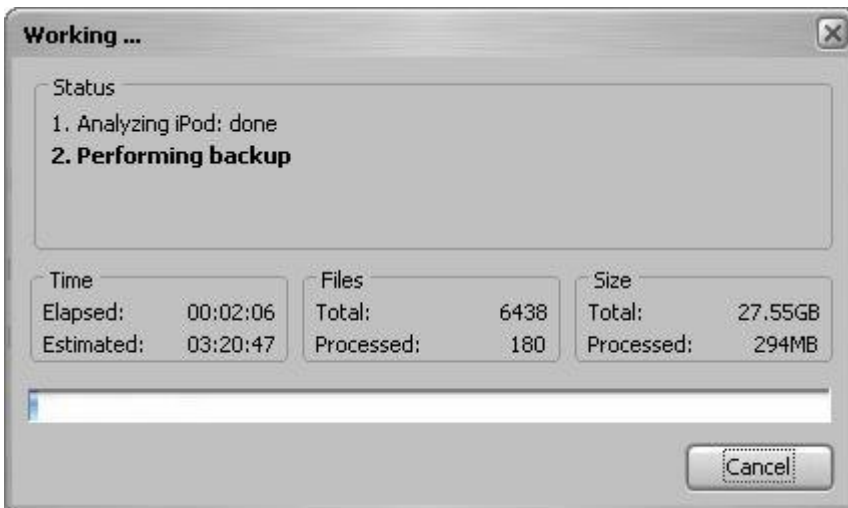
Click Save.



Finally, hit the "Start backup" button.



The backup of your iPod has now started



Once the backup is complete, you can go to the destination folder and check that the backup image was indeed created.

Restoring a backup image.

Note: all the operations you will perform to restore your iPod will take place in the LOWER HALF of iCloner called "Restore".

Restoring a backup image to an iPod is as simple as creating the image and the procedure is pretty similar.

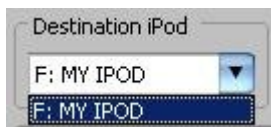
Start by clicking the "Browse..." button in the "Restore" section of iBackup.

A small window opens that lets you browse your computer folders and choose the backup image you wish to use to restore your iPod.



Click on the backup image and hit the "Open" button.

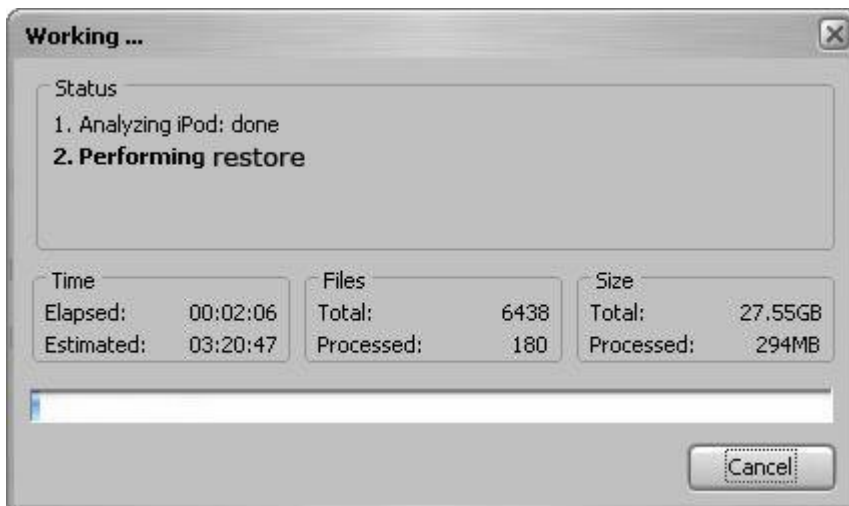
Now, select your iPod in the "Destination iPod" drop down menu in the "Restore" section of iCloner.



Finally, hit the "Start restore" button in the "Restore" section of iCloner.



A progress bar shows you the status of your iPod restoration.



You are all set! Your iPod has just been populated with your music and other personal data.

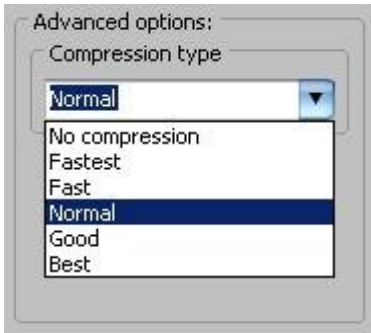
Advanced options

Compression

If you click in the "Advanced options" checkbox,



a new drop down menu appears on the right side of iCloner.



As you guessed it, you can choose "No compression" for a fast and bigger backup file, "Best" for the smallest backup file taking more time to create and to restore or any other intermediate compression.
